- teaching tools, assignments, handouts, graphs, lists, etc. (please send as word docs, labelled clearly)

**LANGUAGE:** Language makes experience visible through new feminist vocabulary (for example, mansplaining, gas-lighting, white-splaining, cis-splaining, etc.). It exposes the power-imbalances, as well as conscious and subconscious practices of devaluing experience. We welcome inclusivity and language equity. The collection will be published in English.
